# ANNUAL REPORT 2017-18







#### **BACKGROUND OF THE ORGANISATION**

Rural Action in Social Emancipation (RAISE) started in the year 2000 under the provisions of Andhra Pradesh Societies Registration Act XXI of 1860. The organization was formed with the co-operation of dedicated social workers and enthusiastic service minded group with a view to help the helpless rural poor community through various developmental activities. The birth of "RAISE" is a response indeed an emotional response to the problems of illiteracy, ignorance, ill health, malnutrition, unemployment and inadequate medical and educational facilities that were widely prevalent in Kadapa, Nellore, karnool and Guntur Districts of Andhrapradesh, India. Hence, the Organization formed with no profit motive and dedicated to solve the identified problems.

We have experience in dealing water issues as most of our previous projects are Providing adequate water, construction of toilets for tribal community, Construction of water tank and taps, Providing drinking water supply to zp high school. We are 11 members working under this as 7 are board members and remaining as volunteers. We are having

good connection with the local people as we are working in these village since 2000 local leaders and panchayithi leaders, local officers which helps in running the project in a smooth manner

Our aim is to allow all people in the community to have access to safe drinking water and sanitation and where no one suffers or dies form water or sanitation related diseases which previously happened there

# Repair of wells, awareness on hygiene and training program in repair of bore wells to unemployed youth

Most of the target village people belongs to backward class. As the target groups are illiterate, ignorant and unorganized, they happen to be the most oppressed and exploited groups in the area with little or no access to developmental opportunities. Here wells constructed around year 1949 and bore wells which are present in the village are constructed around 20 years before. Due to this it came to repair, if working ( wells) properly also which is not clean. As this area belongs to backward class the local government leaders not at all taking action. This leads to drinking of contaminated water, Spreading of communicable diseases.



On the other hand, due to the very nature of the open shallow wells present in the area, the water is usually contaminated, often leading to various water borne diseases including dysentery, diarrhoea, amoebiosis, hepatitis, etc., often affecting the vulnerable and malnutritioned women and children, sometimes even leading to mortality. The high rates of morbidity and mortality among the target women and children are directly related to water and malnutrition.



The target village Josephpet has a big lake. There are around 200 families are present. Most of them belongs to the backward class to which no water facility. People here are uneducated. An assumption that out of 100 people only 5 are educated. People used to bring water directly from lack used to drink directly with out cleaning. That time they were severely hit by cholera disease. Many people have died. That time government took measurements and constructed some wells and later years some bore wells. From that time onwards the wells and bore wells are not cleaned. Most of them are under repair. Now a days the cases of child illness typhoid, diarrhea are increased .Than constructing the new one it is good to repair the existing which is low cost and more useful to the people.



Our project mainly focusing on rehabilitation of existing water supply systems. There are three bore wells and two wells which are mainly used by the people. Repair of the Three bore wells, two wells in which one bore is not at all in working condition, and from remaining bore well mud water is coming out. It is not enough of repairing but also making the people to understand regarding the sanitation, keeping the around environment of wells and bore wells clean it is only possible with by conducting awareness camp on sanitation and hygiene, Formation of the committee who look after these. The above effort is only effective when they know how to repair those so that they need not to depend on help. The single Training program to the youth in the rehabilitation of wells and bore wells allows them to repair them on own with very low cost. This training not only helps to make their locality water supply system repair but also provide employment to the unemployed youth.

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During repair the unemployed youth have been trained. They have been taught with the practical explanation regarding its repair and cleaning. Training is a wonderful part in this program. With lots of interest all the youth has been participated. The expert trainer has been sent by Panchaity member as we requested them that we also need a training person who can teach to repair. The trainer explained very clearly and clarified their doubts very patiently. In this training some of the beneficiaries women and men also actively participated with their interest .

The repair of 3 bore wells and 2 wells is done. Water cleaning machine is used for the removal of mud that is accumulated in the bore. The damaged bores are being replaced by new chain and pipes. Small safety wall is constructed around the bores, application of colors and painting is also done to protect the bores. Wells are cleaned, dewatering is done, bleaching powder and salt is applied for removing the contaminations from wells. New wheels have been installed, small wall is constructed around the wells. The beneficiaries provided their physical support in repair of wells and bore wells.

### **Awareness program**

Two awareness camps has been conducted regarding the sanitation and hygiene. All of them have been participated actively. The explanation is done by showing the pictures. In this meeting the palm plates also has been provided to the beneficiaries. They have been taught that how to the keep the environment around the bore wells and wells clean.

### **Awareness on Dairy products making**



150 Participants will be exposed to training techniques mainly designed to develop their skills and performance in preparation of value added products with milk. Preservation of milk, preparation of curd, cheese, ghee and sweets are the training topics set out to meet their training needs and to overcome their difficulties.





The participants were exposed to training on the value added products in dividing them into batches. With this they can start their own business.

### **Pulse Polio Campaign**

Our Organizers have actively participated in the Pulse Polio Immunization Campaign during January 2017 and March 2017 at our working area. They assisted the Government Officials to identify the eligible children and motivated their parents to immunize them. As a result, 100% immunization has taken place in our targeted area SC colony of Josephpet village.
